## The Sanford transition team includes:

**Jenny Sanford**, South Carolina's next First Lady, managed her husband's campaign to victories in the Republican Primary, runoff and the general election while running a household and raising the couple's four little boys. A former mergers and acquisitions specialist on Wall Street, she also ran her husband's 1994 campaign for the U.S. Congress. She received her B.S.B.A. in Finance from Georgetown University in 1984, graduating magna cum laude.

"I'm here to help pass the baton from the campaign organization to this great group of people my husband has chosen to lead his transition. I look forward to leaving the politics to him and focusing on being a mother and assuming the responsibilities that go with being the First Lady," Jenny Sanford said.

**Keith Munson**, a Greenville attorney, is a veteran of the Persian Gulf War, serving in the 24th Infantry Division (Mechanized). A former Captain in the U.S. Army Judge Advocate General's Corps, Munson was a Norris Medal recipient at Clemson in 1984 before receiving his J.D. from the University of Virginia in 1987.



"I'm grateful for the opportunity to help Gov.-elect Sanford during his transition period. His campaign epitomized the power of ideas and the need for change in Columbia and I look forward to helping him build a strong foundation for that change as he prepares to take office," Munson said.

Former Rep. **Chip Campsen** represented District No. 112 (Charleston County) for the past six years in the state House. During that time he focused on passing market-based conservation initiatives, championing tax and criminal justice reform, and Constitutional law. He received his B.S. from Furman University in 1981, and his J.D. in 1988 and M.B.A. in 1989 from the University of South Carolina. He did not seek reelection this year, honoring a self-imposed limit to serve no more than three terms.

"I've known Mark Sanford for more than twenty-five years, and he's going to make a great governor. I'm excited about assisting him as he leads South Carolina in addressing the pressing issues of the day, such as the budget, education, government restructuring and our quality of life," Campsen said.

**Ken Wingate**, a former Republican candidate for governor, is a Columbia attorney and chairman of the Lottery Accountability Board. He has also served on advisory boards for the American Heart Association, Baptist Medical Center, Columbia College and the Medical University of South Carolina, in addition to serving on the board of the South Carolina Chamber of Commerce. He received his B.S. degree in accounting from Clemson University in 1981 and his J.D. from the University of South Carolina in 1986.

"It's a privilege and an honor to have the opportunity to work with someone like Mark Sanford. He has consistently advanced ideas that he believes to be right regardless of the political consequences -- which is exactly what we need right now in Columbia to bring about the kind of change our state needs," Wingate said.

**Maurice Washington**, a financial advisor who was recently elected chairman of the Board of Trustees at S.C. State University, has held numerous leadership roles during his career -- including serving eight years on the Charleston City Council. He has served or is currently serving as a board member for the Charleston Metro Chamber of Commerce, the Spoleto Festival, SCETV, the Coastal Conservation League and the Trident Urban League. He received his B.S. degree from S.C. State in 1985.

"Mark Sanford possesses a unique ability to cross racial and party lines in making his case for change in South Carolina. He has a powerful vision for this state and I look forward to helping him advance that vision over the coming weeks as he prepares to take the reins of state government," Washington said.

**Clarence Davis**, a Columbia attorney, is a former U.S. Air Force Captain and assistant U.S. Attorney in South Carolina. He served on former Gov. David Beasley's Subcommittee on Economic Development and the South Carolina Jobs Economic Redevelopment Authority. During this time he also served on the Governor's Race Relations Committee. He received both his B.A. in Government and International Studies in 1979 and his J.D. from the

University of South Carolina in 1982.

"Mark Sanford's ability to focus on the economic development issues and address our state's budget crisis will be an invaluable asset to all South Carolinians. I consider it an honor to serve on his transition team and look forward to doing whatever I can to help ensure that his administration starts on as strong a footing as possible," Davis said.

Former Rep. **Rita Allison**, a former candidate for lieutenant governor, has represented District 36 (Spartanburg County) for the past 10 years in the state House. A leading advocate of the Miss South Carolina scholarship program, she has received several awards during her career, including Legislator of the Year from Victims' Advocates, SCSBA and Adult Education Advocates. She has also served as Chairperson of the GOP Women's Caucus and Assistant Majority Leader during her tenure.

"We are fortunate as a state to have such a principled leader as Mark Sanford in the governor's office. I am grateful for the opportunity to be a part of his transition team and particularly excited to head up the transition task force on education," Allison said.

**Burnet Maybank III**, a Columbia attorney, served for four years as director of the South Carolina Department of Revenue under Beasley. Previously, he served as Legal Counsel to Gov. Carroll Campbell, Deputy Securities Commissioner and General Counsel in the Secretary of State's office, Commissioner on the South Carolina Public Service Commission and was a member of the Board at DHEC. He has also received the "Order of the Palmetto" twice. He received his B.A. degree from the University of North Carolina and his J.D. from the University of South Carolina.

"I'm looking forward to helping Mark Sanford carry on the legacy of Gov. Carroll Campbell. His commitment to structural reform and rethinking the way things are done in Columbia is a testament to his passion for ideas and putting what is right over what is political, Maybank said."
