The Latest Word

Helping companies stay up to date with the government's changing rules on how to make sure their products comply with IPv6.

Problem

Many companies, in the Washington, D.C., area and around the country, are interested in obtaining government contracts, which constitute a major sector of the U.S. economy. Some of these companies have never contracted with the government before, while some are already on procurement lists and schedules. In either case, since all government agencies have been mandated to achieve compliance with IPv6 by July 1, 2008, an aspiring contractor needs to use systems that are compliant as well. Those companies therefore need to know the latest word from the government about what constitutes IPv6 compatibility and where in the government the needed resources and information about compatibility can be found.

Actions

At the earliest stage, you should turn to an expert on IPv6 as it relates to government contracting. Many contracts being awarded now will still be in effect in 2008.
